1. Google Workspace

- Google Workspace is a set of cloud computing, productivity, and collaboration tools and products.
- Gmail, Hangouts, Calendar, Google Drive, Docs, Sheets,
 Slides, Keep, Forms, and Sites are some of the software applications that are available in Workspace.
- Workspace adds enterprise features like custom email addresses, unlimited cloud storage, additional administrative tools, advanced settings, and 24/7 phone and email support.
- Users do not see any advertisements while using the services, which means zero interruptions.



2. ActiveCollab

- ActiveCollab literally **mimics the virtual workspace**.
- Users can plan and organise tasks, communicate and collaborate with offshore teams, and track and monitor their progress on the project.
- This tool can help **build a repository of information** regarding the project, deadlines, and any other relevant data.





3. Asana

- This is designed to **improve team collaboration.**
- Teams can create individual projects, assign tasks to teammates, specify deadlines, and communicate about their tasks directly in Asana.
- It includes reporting tools, file attachments, calendars, and many other features.



4. Zoho

- Zoho is a web-based online office suite that contains a portfolio of software project management applications.
- Software project management applications include databases, word processing, spreadsheets, note-taking, wikis, web conferencing, CRMs, presentations, and invoicing.
- It has additional plugins for Microsoft Word and Excel
- Zoho provides web hosting, unlimited storage, bandwidth, and web pages and includes an array of website templates and mobile websites.





5. Basecamp

- **Basecamp helps organise** emails, file services, spreadsheets, chats, task managers, meetings, and so much more.
- It aids in creating to-do lists, assign tasks to team members, and even set due dates for the tasks created.
- Message boards in Basecamp can keep an entire conversation about a specific topic together on a single page.
- Users can customise the post, embed images or files, applaud messages, and share the thread to select individuals
